## Additional Settlement Under Stark Self-Referral Disclosure Protocol

On October 25, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) announced its fourteenth settlement1 under the Voluntary Self-Referral Disclosure Protocol (SRDP). This settlement involved violations of the federal physician self-referral statute (Stark Law) by a general acute care hospital (Hospital) and its hospice facility (Hospice), both located in North Carolina. The Hospital disclosed under the SRDP that it may have violated the Stark Law by: (1) failing to satisfy the requirements of the physician recruitment exception for an arrangement with one physician; (2) failing to satisfy the requirements of the fair market value (FMV) exception for arrangements with two physicians to provide medical director services; (3) failing to satisfy the requirements of the FMV exception for the provision of leadership stipends to thirteen physicians; and (4) failing to satisfy the requirements of the personal services arrangement exception for an arrangement with a group practice to provide ophthalmology services. The Hospital also disclosed on behalf of the Hospice that it may have violated the Stark Law by failing to comply with the FMV exception for arrangements with two physicians to provide hospice services. All violations disclosed were settled for \$584,700. CMS provides a list of "select" self-disclosures resolved under the SRDP, including this settlement.
